The theme for the spring show in September will be 'Orchids on Broadway'

Changes to Container Displays:

The container may be a pot, saucer, basket, part of a hollow tree or any other device to house and support the display. Overall dimensions shall fit within a 50cm square area. A minimum of two (2) flowering orchid plants along with cut flowers shall be in the display plus embellishments using ferns and/or foliage plants and other props which may be used to highlight a theme. The only flowers allowed in the display other than orchids are bromeliads and anthuriums or related types. Flowering orchid plants within the display are eligible for individual judging provided they have a label showing the orchid name on the front with the owner's club number on the reverse side, displayed close to the relevant bloom/s. Container display judging will be based on the overall aesthetic appearance and the quality of <u>all</u> plants included and will be completed <u>before</u> any individual plant judging. No <u>one</u> style of display is ideal. All styles will be of equal value when being judged.

IMPORTANT NOTICE

CHANGE TO R.O.S.I. SHOW RULES

All orchids entered for judging whether in a display, tabled or free hanging, must have a 'Name Label' identifying the plant, in addition to the standard 'Plastic Name-Tag'. The 'Name Label' should be attached as close to the inflorescence as possible either directly to the plant or by means of a suitably unobtrusive support stemming from its pot. The 'Name Label' must include your member number written clearly on the back, and the correct nomenclature and spelling of the name/cross of the plant on the front. A 'Red Spot' marker is to be placed on the front to identify a 'Novice Grower' if applicable. (Available on show set up evening)

If a 'Name Label' is not attached this will signify that the plant is not to be considered for judging; however, this will not result in loss of credit for overall 'Labelling Assessment' or counted as a detraction in the case of display judging. (Examples of Name Labels are below)







CONTAINER GARDENS

THIS SECTION HAS CAUSED SOME CONFUSION IN PREVIOUS SHOWS IN THE DEFINITION OF WHAT IS REQUIRED. HENCE THE NAME OF THIS SECTION HAS BEEN CHANGED TO **CONTAINER DISPLAY**. WE ARE NOT LOOKING FOR A MINITURE GARDEN ALONG WITH HOUSES AND ANIMALS ETC. BUT MORE AN ARTISTIC DISPLAY OF A SELECTION OF ORCHIDS AND FOLIAGE AND EMBELISHMENTS IN A CONTAINER.

CONTAINER DISPLAY GUIDELINE

It is intended as a guideline that a 'Container Display' should be in a format that displays a selection of the exhibitor/s orchids' enhanced with embellishments of orchid-companion plants and supporting materials in a 'container'. Artistic expression is encouraged within the display and can reflect, but not necessarily follow a show's theme.

Stipulations/Rules are:

- 1. The container can be of any 'suitable material: for example large pot/ cane basket / wooden box, but must fit into the allowed 50cmx 50cm space.
- 2. There is no restriction on height.
- 3. A minimum of two 'live flowering potted orchids' must be included in the display.
- 4. To be eligible for judging, an orchid in the display, must have a 'Name Label' (Refer to Show Rules)
- 5. 'Cut Orchid Flowers' can be included but will not be judged.
- 6. The only other flowers allowed in the display are bromeliads and anthuriums or related types.

New Growers Report.

On Saturday the 27th June the new growers were invited by Sandra and Michael Rowcliffe to hold the meeting at their home. This was the first of two repotting workshops to be held this year. On arrival the members gathered together and were invited to look over the gardens and the orchid collection before afternoon tea.

We then had the trouble plant section and after this discussion we went straight into the reporting. My sincere thanks to all the experienced growers who gave us their time and assistance with the reporting. We can all recall the time when we were in the same position in reporting our collections. My thanks to the society for supplying the porting mix and pots for the meeting.

President Jeff was able to attend the meeting and talked about the upcoming trip to Mackay in September. Thanks to Michael and Sandra for having us, we all enjoyed the afternoon. Thanks to all who helped in so many ways and to all who donated to the afternoon's raffle. The raffle completed the afternoon.

The next meeting is to be held at the home of David and Sue Eggleshaw at 49 Peppermint Drive North Rockhampton starting at 2.00pm on Saturday 1st of August. David and Sue are new growers who are just getting started and have kindly invited us to their place. Bring the usual plate and folding chair, and a raffle donation if possible.

Below I have recycled the article on the Dendrobium Beetle to fill space, being that it is a pest that is always present and is the scourge to all orchid growers. I have included photos of the beetle, a pair of mating beetles and the subsequent larvae that they produce.

Dendrobium Beetle: (Stethopachys Formosa)



This pretty little beetle is one of the curses of the orchid grower, we have many pests that try to eat, suck and do other dastardly things to our babies. But the Dendrobium beetle is one you definitely don't want in your bush house. Some people say that they only like our Dendrobiums to eat but I have found over the years that they might have a preference for Dens but really aren't fussed too much what genera of orchid they eat.

The female lays her eggs on the new growths or buds and flowers, but you will mostly find them on new growths and when the eggs hatch out in approximately 10 - 12 days time, the larvae will then tunnel its way into the centre of the stem which will cause the whole stem to die back. They pupate in a white – waxy substance that resembles poly styrene, which is designed to protect the larvae until it becomes adult, this takes around 15 days.

The beetle is detectable by its gold stripe with a black band across the base and 3 black markings in the shoulder region. The larvae is a creamy colour short and dumpy and covered in a slimy goo, then when they advance in the stage towards adult hood they produce a whitish foam and are generally found at the base of your orchid.

They are then at their most destructive stage the adults will eat any flowers, and can decimate new growths as well as new leaves, this can happen in a very short space of time.

Control, first make sure your bush house is insect proof, I consider this is a must to boost your chances of having a grand champion. Some of the learned people will tell you that any spray suitable for beetles will bring about their demise but I have found the block A block B method to be the best. If you find one on a plant, place your hand beneath the beetle and try and grab the little sucker, if you miss him (or her), you'll find that they drop vertically and take it from me if they land on the mix or floor it's virtually impossible to find them. Hopefully they'll lob in your hand, you then decapitate them.

I will have more new members and tales of members' overseas trips to write about next month. Till then my love and prayers are with you.


